Durham Regional Forest Timber's Tract

Welcome to the Timber's Tract of the Durham Regional Forest, Located on the Oak Ridges Moraine in Uxbridge Township, the Trail Capital of Canada, Durham Regional Forest is part of the Durham Trails Network and contains over 63km of trails and has connections to the Trans Canada Trail, Oak Ridges Trail, and Toronto and Region Conservation Authority Trail networks. Durham Regional Forest is made up of six separate tracts of mixed-wood and conifer plantation forests totaling 596 hectares (1,473 acres). These tracts were reforested beginning in the 1920s to reduce soil erosion and increase regional forest cover. Since that time they have been actively managed to reestablish natural forest cover and provide wildlife habitat, education and non-motorized recreational opportunities. At approximately 41.5ha the Timber's Tract is a plantation forest of mostly red pine trees. Ongoing management activities in the forest have encouraged the regeneration of hardwood species such as sugar maple, bitternut hickory and basswood. There are over 3.5 km of trails in the property, with linkages to the Uxbridge Countryside Preserve and other Township trails to the north.
